



# COMMON

# **ACCESSORY SOCKET**




## **CENTER TANK PAD**




- · Check the accessory mounts frequently.
- Clean this accessory with a soft cloth soaked with a solution of mild detergent and water. Then wipe with a clean cloth soaked with water to clean dirt and detergent. Finally wipe dry with a soft, clean cloth
- The maximum power rating of connected accessories is 12W (12V, 3A).
- Use accessories with the engine running to avoid discharging the battery.
- Do not use a cigarette lighter, as this can cause a malfunction.
- Cover the socket with the cap when the accessory socket is not used to prevent entry of foreign objects.
- · Carefully secure any connected devices, as vibrations may cause them to shift unexpectedly.
- Do not use the accessory socket when the motorcycle is being washed.
- Make sure that the cable of device connected to the accessory socket does not disturb the steering operation or riding. Do not pinch the cable to prevent from being damaged.
- Check the accessory mounts frequently and retighten if necessary.
- Clean this accessory with a soft cloth soaked with a solution of mild detergent and water. Then wipe
  with a clean cloth soaked with water to clean dirt and detergent. Finally wipe dry with a soft, clean
  cloth.

- · Check the accessory mounts frequently.
- Clean this accessory with a soft cloth soaked with a solution of mild detergent and water. Then wipe with a clean cloth soaked with water to clean dirt and detergent. Finally wipe dry with a soft, clean cloth.


# **FRONT FORK BOOT**



- Check the accessory mounts frequently and retighten if necessary.
- Clean this accessory with a soft cloth soaked with a solution of mild detergent and water. Then wipe with a clean cloth soaked with water to clean dirt and detergent. Finally wipe dry with a soft, clean cloth.



## FRONT FORK COVER




- · Check the accessory mounts frequently.

# **MAIN SEAT**




- Check the accessory mounts frequently.

### RIGHT HANDLE LEVER ASSEMBLY




- · Check the accessory mounts frequently.


# **ADJUSTING METHOD**



- Turn the adjuster until the numbers align with the index mark while pushing the lever forward in the desired position.
  - After adjustment, check that the lever operates correctly before riding.


# METER VISOR



- Handle this accessory with care. It can be damaged when it is bent excessively or is subject to strong shock or impact.
- Park the motorcycle in the shade when it is to be left unattended in the summer for an extended period of time with a body cover placed over it.
- Failure to observe this precaution can cause this accessory to be deformed due to heat built up under the body cover.
- Select a firm, level surface when you park the motorcycle. Also bear in mind that strong wind can cause the motorcycle to topple to the ground.
- Check the accessory mounts frequently and retighten if necessary.
- When this accessory becomes dirty, rinse it thoroughly with cool water to remove loose dirt, then wipe with a clean cloth or sponge. Do not use a brush to clean this accessory as it may scratch the surface.
- Never use organic solvents such as gasoline, thinner or benzene to clean this accessory. Also do not use acid or alkaline cleaners.
- Wipe up spilled brake fluid at once as it may damage the plastic surface.


## **HEADLIGHT COWL**

## **REAR CARRIER**





# **BACKREST**




- Check the accessory mounts frequently and retighten if necessary.
- Never use organic solvents such as gasoline, thinner or benzene to clean this accessory. Also do not use acid or alkaline cleaners.
- Clean this accessory with a soft cloth soaked with a solution of mild detergent and water. Then wipe with a clean cloth soaked with water to clean dirt and detergent. Finally wipe dry with a soft, clean cloth.

# **SADDLEBAG**



LEFT SADDLEBAG




• The weight of the cargo must not exceed the following maximum loading capacity:

Left saddlebag 3.0 kg (6.6 lb) Right saddlebag 3.0 kg (6.6 lb)

- Check that saddle bags and straps do not interfere with the motorcycle body. Pay special attention to hot parts and rotating parts.
- Check that the fastener is closed and the strap is tightened before riding.
- The inner bag is made of a material that is resistant to water from the outside, but is not completely waterproof due to its structure.
   There is a possibility of internal condensation or inundation due to the influence of heat while riding, running in the rain for a long time, or motorcycle washing.
- Due to the nature of the inner bag, do not store dangerous items, sharp objects, protrusions, or valuables.
- · Check the accessory mounts frequently.
- Clean this accessory with a soft cloth soaked with a solution of mild detergent and water or a cleaner.
- If this accessory becomes completely wet (water has soaked through the material), remove this accessory and allow it to air dried at room temperature. Never dry this accessory in a dryer, in front of a heater, or near a fireplace.


# **SADDLEBAG SUPPORT**



- Check the accessory mounts frequently and retighten if necessary.
- Never use organic solvents such as gasoline, thinner or benzene to clean this accessory. Also do not use acid or alkaline cleaners.
- Clean this accessory with a soft cloth soaked with a solution of mild detergent and water. Then wipe with a clean cloth soaked with water to clean dirt and detergent. Finally wipe dry with a soft, clean cloth.

# HOW TO INSTALL THE SADDLEBAG


- 1. Install the left saddlebag as shown.
  - · Repeat on the right side.



SHOULDER STRAP


## **HOW TO USE THE SHOULDER STRAP**

- 1. Hook the shoulder strap as shown.
  - Always store the shoulder strap when not in use.
  - Use the shoulder strap when carrying the saddlebag.



## **HOW TO REMOVE THE SADDLEBAG**

- Lower the lever as shown and remove the left saddlebag.
  - Repeat on the right side.


